## How do I check my version of OS X?

If you are not sure if your computer's version of OS X meets the MyELT system requirements, you can check it by:

- 1. On your desktop, click the icon in the top left corner of your screen
- 2. Click **About this Mac**

## How do I disable my pop-up blocker?

# Google Chrome

- 1. Click the menu icon.
- 2. Select **Settings**.
- 3. Click **Show Advanced Settings** at the bottom of the page.
- 4. Under Privacy, click Content Settings.
- 5. In the **Pop-Ups** section, select **Allow all sites to show pop-ups**.

**Note**: If you wish to choose which websites to allow pop-ups for and still keep the blocker functionality, choose **Manage Exceptions** instead. Write down the list of websites you don't want Chrome to automatically block pop-ups for.

### Mozilla Firefox

- 1. Open Firefox and click **Firefox** in your menu bar. Select **Preferences**.
- 2. Click the **Content** tab.
- 3. On the first option, uncheck **Block pop-up windows**. This will disable the pop-up blocker for all websites.

**Note**: If you wish to choose which websites to allow pop-ups for and still keep the blocker functionality, choose **Exceptions** instead. Write down the list of websites you don't want Firefox to automatically block pop-ups for.

#### Safari

- 1. Open Safari and click on the Safari dropdown menu.
- 2. Select **Preferences.**
- 3. Navigate to the **Security** tab.
- 4. Uncheck **Block pop-up windows** to disable the functionality.

**Note**: You cannot manage exceptions in Safari. Disabling this functionality will apply to all websites.

#### How do I enable cookies?

# Google Chrome 10.x

- 1. Click the menu icon
- 2. Click the **Settings** control.
- 3. Near the bottom of the page, click **Show advanced settings...**
- 4. Click **Content Settings....**
- 5. Click Allow local data to be set.

### Firefox

- 1. Click **Firefox** in the upper left corner
- 2. Click **Preferences**
- 3. Click Privacy
- 4. Click the **Firefox will...** dropdown and choose **User custom settings for history**.
- 5. Click the **Accept cookies from sites** checkbox.
- 6. Click **OK**.



## Apple Safari

- 1. Click the **Safari** dropdown in the top left of the screen.
- 2. Select **Preferences**.
- 3. Under the *Block Cookies* section, click **Never**.

# How do I clear my browser's cache?

### Chrome

- 1. Click the menu icon.
- 2. Click **Show Advanced Settings**.
- 3. Navigate to the *Privacy* section and click **Clear Browsing Data**
- 4. Click **Empty the Cache** 
  - a. Note: Uncheck all other options to avoid deleting browser history, cookies and other things you may wish to retain. Change *Obliterate the following items from* to **the beginning of time**.
- 5. Click **Clear browsing data.**

## Firefox

- 1. Click the **Tools** menu in your browser menu bar.
- 2. Select Clear Recent History
- 3. Make sure *Details* is expanded and click **Cache** from the list. Uncheck everything else.
- 4. In the *Time Range to Clear* menu, select **Everything**.
- 5. Click Clear Now.

## Safari

- 1. Open your browser and click the Safari menu.
- 2. Select **Empty Cache**.
- 3. Click **Empty**.
